South Hartismere Benefice

April Newsletter 2019 Easter ...

I am very glad that one of the churches in our eight-parish benefice (Thornham Magna) is named after St Mary Magdalene. Mary Magdalene is one of my favourite biblical characters, but she has been pretty poorly treated over the centuries. For a long time, Mary was identified with the repentant prostitute described in the Bible as having washed Jesus's feet with her hair. There is nothing to support that connection (other than that it makes a good story) but that didn't prevent her name being associated for a long time with institutions for 'fallen women' - like the Magdalen Hospital founded in London in the 1750s, and numerous other Magdalene Asylums and Magdalene Laundries across the world.

My interest in Mary Magdalene is not, however, in her undeserved reputation, but in her role in the Easter story. Three of the four gospels (the Biblical books that tell the story of Jesus's life) name her as being in the small group of Jesus's followers who stood by the cross during the slow hours of his agonising death. Think of that scene, and of how appalling it must have been: watching a dear friend dying a terrifying death before your eyes.

But there is more to Mary's role than just a compassionate friend. The four gospels each tell in different ways the story of Jesus's resurrection. But they *all* agree that it was women who were the first to come to his tomb, that Sunday morning, and they all name Mary as having been there, whether with others or on her own. It was faithful Mary Magdalene who brought the message that Jesus was alive back to the fearful, disbelieving men.

Early critics of Christianity seized on the part played by women on the first Easter morning. You can't trust the Resurrection story, they said, because the central witnesses were only WOMEN (!!) Now, of course, we see things differently. It's the very fact that the first witnesses were women that makes their testimony so compelling: a contemporary chronicler, sitting down to invent a resurrection story, would be unlikely to give such a key role to women.

In our churches on every Easter Sunday, we join in the ancient acclamation: "Christ is Risen! He is risen, indeed!" As I repeat those words, I say a special thank you to Mary Magdalene - the very first person who knew it was true.

Because, if it is true, then i	t changes everything

Stoke Ash Gardening Club

In January we had a talk on "The realm of the Polar Bear" given by Chris Parfitt. It did not appear to be garden based. However there were slides showing plants and flowers on the Arctic islands where the Polar Bears were photographed. It was very interesting, with some very good slides showing the Polar Bears. This was followed by another talk on "Garden Design" by a Karen Sanders on Monday 25th February in the Hall, Karen is based in Mendlesham and has been commissioned to design gardens in various locations. She described how she completed these from scratch. Starting with the borders, the paths and then planting the perennials' and flowers.

STOKE ASH WI

Our January speaker was Deborah, who came to tell us about the Lighthouse Women's Aid. This charity supports a women's refuge in Ipswich which opened in 1976. Deborah has been with the organisation for 3 years and told us about some of the work they do to support the women and families who come to them. The women are usually referred from out of the immediate area, as to keep them close to where the domestic abuse has been taking place would leave them open to danger, as they could bump into their abuser in the street or, if they have to go to local schools or work, they could be traced back to the refuge. Likewise, women and families from Suffolk would be taken care of outside of their home area for the same reasons.

The refuge was set up to offer a temporary, safe place for women to go while they consider their options to get themselves and their children into long-term, safe accommodation. There are professionals in the organisation to assist them in coping with the physical, emotional and practical issues they face. The charity is part-funded by national and local organisations and bodies, but they do also rely on donations from private individuals to keep them going.

For our February meeting we asked Clive Stevens, who spoke to us one evening last year, to tell us more about "Suffolk in World War II". This time, we went to Clive's converted barn where he could comfortably accommodate all the WI, and this time we were joined by friends and family members. He told us more about the work of the American servicemen and how they integrated with local people. He also showed us more of his slides, many of them showing pictures of local towns and villages. He had pictures of some of the unfortunate accidents that happened involving the US planes. One crashed in Brome, sadly killing 13 crew and 4 local council workers who were working on the road there. It's information like this that was so fascinating and now, driving through and past the places he spoke about, I find myself thinking more about what went on all those years ago and how their contribution to the war didn't just change national history, but very much affected local lives. I have a feeling there's a lot more we can find out from Clive and I'm sure we'll be hearing from him again.

If any ladies have been thinking of coming along but still haven't made it, please join us this year. You can come as a guest for an evening and, if you'd rather not come alone, contact the President, whose details are in the newsletter, who can put you in touch with someone who will bring you in and introduce you. There's a warm welcome waiting for you!
