Annual Parish Meeting 2022, Stoke Ash and Thwaite Parish Council Report

I would like to start this years report not with a list of Parish Council activities throughout the year, but with recognition and thanks to all Parish Councillors for their enthusiasm, generosity, and hard work on behalf of all the residents of Stoke Ash and Thwaite. Despite the workload involved in just the day to day and legal obligations fulfilled by the Council, each and every Councillor has found time to be involved in what could be termed "extra" activities on behalf of the villages. In fact most activities in the villages will now find a Councillor involved in some capacity, ranging from organising, contributing, and taking part in Christmas celebrations, to running Thwaite Projects Group, Stoke Ash Village Hall committee, organising and updating the Allotments, and much else.

All of this is in addition to more normal Council work, such as monitoring grit bins etc. Also this year some considerable time has been spent on unwelcome commercial developments as we seek to protect and enhance our villages as being pleasant and peaceful places to enjoy our homes. 2022 is Jubilee year, and Councillors are currently spending many hours in order to make this an event to remember. We are very fortunate to have such dedicated and community-minded people in our villages.

Parish Council meetings have now reverted to being held once every two months, as the hoped for benefits of the change to monthly have not been apparent, with the monthly meetings becoming hardly any shorter. However there is always the possibility of extra meetings if need be.

Meetings are on the third Thursday of every second month, and are always advertised on the village notice board(s), and usually on Stoke Ash and Thwaite Villages website.

All are welcome to the meetings, and there is time set aside specifically for members of the public wishing to speak. We are always keen to hear from residents with any questions or matters of concern as well as any suggestions, and hope that Parish Council will be your first port of call, either via a Councillor or our very efficient Clerk.

Minutes of meetings and agendas are available on the website, along with lots of other interesting things about the villages.

As always I would encourage readers to refer to previous years annual reports, which can also be found on the website.

Having earlier congratulated and thanked Councillors for all that they do, I must also mention that there are currently two vacancies in Stoke Ash, which if filled would spread the work a little!

Finally I would just like to thank everyone in the villages for being such good neighbours and caring about our community, which makes it easier for enthusiasm to be maintained and the Councillors job so much more rewarding.

Meetings are now held bi- monthly, July, September, November etc on the third Thursday evening of the month, 7.30pm at Stoke Ash Village Hall. We would be very pleased to hear from you.

<u>Holiday Lets, The Street, Stoke Ash</u> – noise disturbance – a letter was sent to the owner of the properties raising parishioners concerns over the frequent disturbances, particularly late at night when the hot tubs are in use. The owner stated he was surprised to hear of the rowdy behaviour. These were award winning luxury holiday lets and guest requests were checked for their previous reviews. Guests with unsatisfactory reviews from other hosts would be declined. The agent managing the properties had not received complaints of antisocial behaviour. The agent, Abode East Anglia was available at any time on 07799 902663 to take calls and parishioners were urged to contact the agent should there be any further disturbances and importantly to keep a record of the date, time and nature of the disturbance as they occur.



Celebration of HM the Queen's Platinum Jubilee June 2,3,4,&5, 2022

Before Christmas 2021 initial discussions were taking place as to how the Queen's Jubilee should be celebrated in our villages. After Easter, with the formal announcement of a 4 day national holiday, the Parish Council formed a planning team headed by Tony Pulham with Gordon Leggett,

Val Lane & Geoff Tancred in support. An initial request of Shane and Anne of the White Horse pub to quote for the cost of an evening meal led, after some consultation, to an offer to organise a complete programme of events over the first two days. It was a most generous and public spirited suggestion, which included playing areas with bouncy castle for children, afternoon tea, a burger bar, live music and a beer festival bar set up in out buildings. We were delighted to accept this offer, especially as it included a drink, something from the BBQ, and the afternoon tea, all of which would be free to our villagers.



For the remaining two days, it was decided to hold a fete on the village green, with stalls in a marquee, a summer punch and cider bar, a BBQ, a grab and smash crockery stall and a shooting gallery with Putin & Boris targets on the Saturday, and a fancy dress and dog dress up competitions, and a raffle.





A children's street party was planned for the Sunday, with an entertainer, sweets, ice cream & drinks. This meant getting a drinks licence for the bar, and permission to close The Street alongside the Stoke Ash village hall and green.



A programme of events was produced which was delivered to each house in the villages and outlying areas, together with vouchers for each family for the White Horse goodies. The opportunity was taken to find out how many children would be likely to attend the street party, as well as checking for allergies and preferences which needed to be considered. As it turned out, it quickly became obvious that too few children would be coming to the street party, so a quick rethink led to an invite to everyone to join in a picnic party on the village green, in the Village Hall or the marquee. The entertainer had already been booked, and all the street party paraphernalia bought, with children's drinks, cakes, ice cream, sweets and other goodies which would still be available. The 'long weekend ' turned out to be highly successful in all its phases.

The White Horse partying was enjoyed not only by the villagers but was also open to the public (at a cost). With copious sandwiches, cakes and goodies of the 'Afternoon Teas', the bouncy castle, the live music, outside TV available and the BBQ and Jubilee ales and excellent live band, the atmosphere was absolutely buzzing with happy enjoyment. The pub staff were friendly, efficient and helpful and a credit to their employers.



Our fete was extremely successful, and covered its costs, as well as those of the picnic

on the following day. The clotted cream scones served up in the Hall were absolutely outstanding and much in demand, as were the variety of cakes , ice cream and drinks .Each of the stands did a roaring trade, perhaps partly because costs were relatively minimal. Music outside was supplied by 'Lolly' Turner, - an excellent and appropriate choice, at a restrained but adequate volume.





The table sales in the marquee went well, with raffle table doing a great job, and the church sales and Posh nearly new sales doing particularly well.

Activities in the field were much patronised, and the Dog dress up competition, judged by our Police Commissioner for Suffolk was great fun.



Opportunity was taken to give Lionel and Shiela Coe an inscribed platter thanking them for all the years of their hard work and dedication to our village life.

The arrival of a WWII american army truck and jeep created an atmospheric interest to the proceedings and a commemorative china mug was presented for each family in the villages (those who did not attend, mugs will be delivered to their homes in due time as more had to be reordered).

With the Village Street closed, and the Children's Street party converted to an all welcome picnic, the proceedings were brought to life by Eddie Portsmouth, AKA Ali Shazam who entertained for well over the time he was hired for. He did an excellent job, keeping both children and adults amused and fascinated by his patter, magic tricks, and balloon bending for the children. The Maisey family did a sterling job dispensing drinks, ice creams, cakes and jubilee noise makers.



By 4.30 pm, the party moved into the marquee where white bubbly wine was dispensed to all adults for a loyal toast to HM the Queen, followed by a loud rendering of the National Anthem and three cheers for Her Majesty.

The dismantling of the marquee and other tents, and general tidying up was to be completed over the next few days.

Without the assistance of many helpers, putting the marquee up, and later dismantling it would have been a very difficult task. Thank you to all who came and helped throughout the weekend, be it in manning stalls, taking part in competitions and activities, dispensing food and alcohol, laughing with the entertainer, and above all, supporting our village activities.





Stoke Ash Women's Institute is 50 years old!

Stoke Ash Women's Institute is celebrating it's 50th Anniversary in August and will be marking this important event with a Summer Tea Party on the village green.

Earlier this year, one of our members visited The Hold in Ipswich to view the first records of the formation of our WI and it makes interesting reading.

The first record on 20th April 1972 stated:

An exploratory meeting was held in the Old School, Stoke Ash, to consider forming a Women's Insitute, and 19 ladies were present..... It was decided that the ladies would meet in May for further discussion.... and a [further] meeting on 14th June..... it would then be decided whether to form a W.I. named Stoke Ash...

The first official meeting was held on 9th August 1972, where it was decided that meetings would be held on the 2nd Wednesday of the month at 7.30pm in the Old School, the hire for which was 50p.

The first officers elected were:

President – Mrs Ruth Shuttleworth Secretary – Mrs J Adshead Treasurer – Miss J Lummis Vice President – Dr B Vaudrey

After 50 years it is interesting to see how our 'small but perfectly formed' WI has evolved and changed, but also remains the same. For instance we still meet at the same place, at the same time and on the same day! The cost of hall hire has risen of course but still provides an excellent venue and value for money. Our numbers have remained steady over the years and we have a current membership of 15 ladies.

The documents at The Hold detailed the minutes of many of the meetings held from those early days through to 2003. It was interesting to note the formality in the minutes with the use of surnames only and the ladies identified as Mrs or Miss. Gradually first names were introduced and by the end of the century only first names were used!

Several ladies who appeared in the records in the early days are still members today. One of the founding members was Barbara Vaudrey who was elected Vice President at the first meeting, served on the Committee from 1970 to 1984 and was President from 1971 to 1972. She remained a member until just a few years ago and died in December 2021.

To commemorate our Anniversary and the life of Barbara Vaudrey, we will be dedicating a tree on the village green as part of our celebrations on 14th August.

STOKE ASH WI

The May meeting is where we discuss and vote on the national Resolution. This years' resolution is titled "Women and girls with ASD and ADHD under-identified, under-diagnosed and under-supported".

Female sufferers of Autistic Spectrum Disorder and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder

The WI is calling on the government to ring-fence funds to research the presentation of autism in females as it is known to be generally different to the presentation in males, and this is part of the reason it has gone unrecognised in girls and women for so long.


