
Stoke Ash Village Hall Lottery

Giving a helping hand

Over the Christmas period hopefully we have all been able to meet up with our families and friends and spend quality time together.

It came to my attention that sometimes when we have not been blessed with children or parents living locally to us there could well be a big gap in who we could call upon if something happens with our health or we have an accident and need to get to A & E or other such requirement.

With the other difficulty of us living in a rural area I have also been advised that there are other villages close to us that offer various 'helps' for Neighbours.

For the Bacton and Cotton area we have 'The Good Neighbours are Here' with a mobile number that can be used to contact somebody between the hours of 9am to 5pm seven days a week.

For the Old Newton & Gipping residents we have a scheme called D.O.N.G which also provides a mobile number that can be used to contact a Helper. If travelling is involved a small charge of 45p per mile is requested to cover petrol/diesel costs (the 45p per mile is the figure that the HMRC gives for the tax free amount that can be paid for this help without the Helper being taxed).

Is this something that we in Stoke Ash & Thwaite ought to offer our residents?

We would have to make sure that the 'helper' is DBS approved and that Public Liability Insurance is in place. Perhaps as a Parish Council this could be discussed at a future meeting, let me know if you have any ideas or that you would be a willing volunteer.

The final two meetings of each year are different to our usual meetings as we don't generally have speakers or set activities. They are the AGM in November and our Christmas dinner meeting in December.

In November, once our new committee had been elected and the annual business of the group was taken care of, the rest of the evening was spent in conversation with our fellow members and enjoying the refreshments brought to the meeting. We inevitably look back over the past year and what we've seen and done at our meetings. Our speakers this year have covered subjects from far away and as diverse as penguins in the Falkland Islands and what Romania has to offer besides tales of Dracula. From closer to home, we heard about bees and wasps of Suffolk, the Bartlett Martello Tower at Felixstowe, the Home Start charity helping Suffolk families, The Tithe War in Suffolk and Tudor Life with a focus on Thomas Wolsey, who was born and brought up in Ipswich before becoming a leading figure at the court of Henry VIII. In the summer we held a meeting in the garden of a member at Wickham Skeith. It was a beautiful afternoon and was filled with sunshine, strawberries and fun. In contrast, on a rather dark and chilly October evening we spent our time decorating wine bottles with glue and serviettes and finally putting strings of tiny lights inside to illuminate the pretty coverings and brighten the room with them.

In December, we returned again to The Four Horseshoes at Thornham Magna for our Christmas dinner. The food and service didn't disappoint and our servers were as pleasant and helpful as ever. Secret Santa was another highlight of the evening when all manner of gifts were given and received. We also enjoyed outings to some local attractions, including the Aldeburgh Theatre in the summer and a garden centre.

Stoke Ash and Thwaite Parish Council – report on meeting held 16 November 2023

<u>Flooding</u> – the impact of the October storms and flooding were discussed at some length, Wickham Road, Thwaite and Deadman's Lane, Stoke Ash in particular. Flooding at the Wickham Road/A140 junction had caused access problems and seemed to occur during normal rainfall. This has been reported to Suffolk CC Highways and they have agreed to investigate that problem. Maintenance requests have been made to Suffolk CC Highways regarding Deadman's Lane: reinstatement of damaged verges and blocked gulley's, provision of a double-sided High-Water Sign at the ford to give warning from both directions, clearance of drainage pipes under the road at the Ford and Bridge and a flood warning sign at the Deadman's Lane/The Street junction to give additional advance warning.

County Councillor Stringer had provided a useful document on Riparian Ownership & Maintenance responsibility for rivers, tributaries and ditches (please let a councillor or the clerk know if you would like a copy) and useful flood advice can be obtained from the following websites: www.gov.uk and a Homeowners Guide for flood impacted homeowners www.floodmary.com The Parish Council will look into preparing a local flood hotspot and responsibility guide, this will assist in monitoring flood prone areas. Please do let the Council know of areas that you believe should be included.

<u>Parish Council Vacancies</u> – there are still three vacancies in Stoke Ash. It really is important that all areas of the village are represented at a local level so as to keep the parish council informed of issues concerning the community. There are 6 evening meetings per year, held at Stoke Ash Village Hall: January, March, May, July, September and November. The Parish Council makes recommendations to the District Council regarding planning applications, determines a budget for its annual expenditure, monitors highways and the wellbeing of both Stoke Ash and Thwaite. Please do contact a Councillor or the Clerk if you think you may be interested in joining the Council, we would be very pleased to hear from you.

<u>Neighbourhood Plan</u> – this has been put on hold at the moment.

<u>Coffee Caravan</u> – Cllrs Geoff Tancred and Mrs Lane gave a very good report on their experience of the Coffee Caravan which is a scheme set up to visit rural communities on a monthly basis offering a meeting time and place for parishioners to meet for coffee and advice if required on rural issues. It is hoped a visit to Stoke Ash will be arranged initially on a trial basis.

The Mysterious case of the missing house in Stoke Ash

"When you have eliminated the impossible, whatever remains, however improbable, must be the truth"



Hello, my name is Graham and my wife is Jean. We moved to Stoke Ash village on the 29th of July 2022 after purchasing a garden building plot, which had outline planning permission. First priority: get a mobile home or caravan on site. We could not get a mobile on site due to the narrow road and the ditch on our side of the road (we've nicknamed the ditch 'The Moat'). So it had to be a caravan, and yes you have to

pay council tax when living on site. We promptly called ourselves 'The trailer trash of Stoke Ash'. A sense of humour and patience is needed if you're self builders.

We were often asked about our plans by passing neighbours (and were very happy to talk about them, the plans not the neighbours!). House or bungalow? House, because a bungalow on the same foot print is relatively more costly due to there being no upstairs. How long do you think it will take to build?

Due to being an ICF (insulated concrete formwork) very quick. Think hollow



Lego Bricks infilled with concrete and you get the idea. We expected to have been in for Christmas 2023.

So, what went wrong? Hmm, we wrote to several architects asking if they would be interested in taking on our project. The first three companies we contacted didn't even reply to our enquiry. That wasted a few weeks whilst we waited for them to contact us. We eventually had success and instructed a local company. The original architect used by our sellers, screwed up on the site entry and exit site lines. This was not the fault of Ben and Becca, they paid for a professional. The problem only came to light once we engaged our own firm of architects who pointed out the problem.

So, being a retired carpenter and joiner I am used to solving problems for people,

The architect said, no we need a topographical survey to do our job, and it's only going to cost you roughly £600. Translated this means get a surveyor to mark all trees and bushes on each side of the road in both directions, and position of the road to submit to planning (roads are very sneaky, they move when you're not looking!) Planning would then consult with the Highways department for their opinion. Suffice to say I was not a happy bunny (ask Jean) and let the architect know in no uncertain terms. I do not like it when others try to spend your money to make their lives easier. Funny thing, the architect didn't speak to me for a while and we had to deal with the understudy. Ok, so what happened next?

Well our local Parish Councillors gave us lots of help and support and suggested we speak with our local District Councillor, David Burn, who gave a great deal of help.

After about six months, and a lot of work by David and ourselves but no help from the architect, the issue was resolved. How? Wait for it, moving the entrance point. Whilst the entrance issue was going on, the architect did not submit planning and building reg applications. Thus we lost valuable time and when they did act they only submitted planning. Once these were approved with conditions they then submitted building regs. More time was lost because they did not look at the Jackon building system and their extensive technical library for standard details.

I must admit I got fed up with constantly being asked about the standard details, so I telephoned Building control and spoke with our area BC officer which proved very productive and resulted in permission being granted.

Full steam ahead? No, now it was October the weather could be a problem and when you need foundation trenches, water and trench collapse can be very dangerous. As has happened, it's been a tad damp of late!Spring and good weather will soon be here, bring on the global warming?

"Amazing Holmes, so that solves the mystery of the missing house of Stoke Ash". "Elementary my dear Watson, elementary".

These are just a few of the problems we've encountered over the last year and a half but we are looking forward to 2024 and building our new home.

Finally, again a big thank you to our local Parish Councillors and David Burn. It has also been nice to chat with our fellow villagers about our plans throughout the past seventeen months. Happy New Year to all.

Getting the job done!

On Thursday January 18th our bye-monthly parish council meeting was held in Stoke Ash village hall. It was good to see various local people from our two villages attend who were able to put forward and discuss with councillors and our local Ipswich County Councillor Andrew Stringer the problems that various people have had with the resent floods and repairs to our roads.

We were enlightened on how the Council system works in both Ipswich County Council and our Mid Suffolk District Council and the frustrations that we all have in getting jobs done.

With any organisation there is not just one person that can make things happen as we all need each other to respond in unity. Andrew explained that in the administration of Council that people from land owners, river authorities, various councils and sections of the community and government have to come together to work out a plan to address the problems that we are encountering.

We voiced our frustrations in not seeing a quick reaction and fixing of problems and the hope is that the message gets through, that those who have the power to implement the changes needed, will get on to make it happen.

Many of us are frustrated that we see so often people 'passing the buck' rather than taking responsibility to get the job done.

On this point can I bring to the attention of you all the **'Reporting Tool'** that is available for everyone who has internet connection to get to it and report online the pot holes, damaged or missing road signs, flooding in 'pince areas of ditches and rivers' or any dangerous obstacles that would endanger life on the roads and pathways.

www.suffolk.gov.uk/highways then go to 'Report a Highways issue'

Andrew advised us of the Council meeting on 7th December, a motion was passed for the council to review the frequency of drain and gully clearance in areas at risk of flooding and to work closely with districts and boroughs, Anglian Water and the Environment Agency to help prevent future flooding.

South Hartismere Benefice

As I write I am in a reflective mood. Today is 8th December, a day that lives long in my memory. On that day in 1978, as a 10-year-old, I had insisted on walking home from school rather than being driven home by my mother. It was only when I regained consciousness some weeks later and being aware that I was in a hospital bed, with impaired vision, a thumping headache and my leg in plaster that I realised that something had not quite gone to plan.



I had been hit by a speeding pickup truck whilst crossing the road with the "lollipop" lady. The events of the day had put my parents through turmoil, and for a short time they had not known whether I was dead or alive. If it were not for the actions of a passing stranger, who removed my face from a puddle whilst others stood paralysed with fear, not knowing whether to move my motionless body, then maybe I would not be here to tell this story. I still carry his letter that he wrote to my parents wishing me well.

Then came the repercussions from my mother. Why had I insisted on walking home? Why hadn't the driver seen me? Why had he been driving so fast? And then my mother's guilt, that she had given me a choice and despite her reservations, she had allowed me to exercise free will, even if this was against her better judgement. In all this, she never stopped loving me or left her bedside vigil.

As I write, I am dealing with the aftermath of storm Babet. Fortunately, as distressing as it is to lose personal possessions and suffer property damage, there was no loss of life. Naturally there is some anger about how and why this flooding has happened, and who is to blame and was there more that could have been done to clear blocked drains and ditches. A while ago such events would have been called an "act of God", such as the 1953 floods, the 1987 hurricane and now the 2023 Storm Babet.

Perhaps it is only natural to question God, after all on the cross, had Jesus not questioned God when he exclaimed "My God my God, why have you abandoned me?". So, do we too ask why God allows such things to happen, do we question our faith, or help those who chose to blame a God they do not believe exists?

As I continue to reflect, I turn things round in my mind and if my mother were alive today, perhaps I would ask her about the events of 1978; why did the stranger stop and save me when others stood by? Why did I make a full recovery with no lasting disabilities (although some of course some would question what a large bang on the head has done to my personality!) and perhaps, most importantly why did I not die, as the chances of surviving an impact with a truck travelling 40 mph are just 15%?.

Coming back to storm Babet, perhaps it is an "act of mankind" and we are responsible for the events which are unfolding before us, more than just blocked drains and ditches, so some may say where is the relevance of God in all this? I believe that God allows us to believe or not believe, the freedom to choose and the freewill to effectively do as we please and go the way of our choosing, despite the disastrous consequences that follow. He loves us and will not abandon us, so in addition to the letter of 1978, I also carry the bible, as I believe in the goodness of mankind and also in God's love and mercy – I still have far more to thank Him for than many will ever know.

Stoke Ash & Thwaite Christmas Tree suggestions for Parish Council Attention Dec 2023

- 1. Dig out the channels into ditches, plus put dyke weirs in sloped areas, which slows lots of water to lower areas, at least every 2 years. Ditches are like mini rivers or streams.
- 2. Village hall needs to be able to park about 20 cars in its car park when events are being held, not parked around the village.
- 3. Better signage at the top of Deadmans Lane, about ford/flooding, and unsuitable for diversions.
- 4. 30 MPH flash sign on Roman Way
- 5. Need new 30 signs along Church Lane close to A140 and along Roman Way Cut gullies to lead water from the road into ditches in both Stoke Ash & Thwaite, so water can get into the ditches etc., and ditches dug out.
- 6. Please clear the culvert at the end of Wickham Rd where it joins the A140 Rubbish blocking it?

DON'T FALL FOR A TELEPHONE SCAM

Fraudster who want to get your money and you never see them again don't need to knock on your door. They can use your phone and a convincing line of patter to get you to give them your personal details and credit card or bank account numbers. They then use the information you have given them to make fraudulent withdrawals from your funds.

Here are some facts about phone scammers to watch out for.

A call from someone who says they are from your bank or credit card provider.

- 1. BANKS AND CREDIT CARD COMPANIES WILL NEVER COLD CALL YOU LIKE THIS.
- 2. Just hang up immediately and phone the customer services number on your credit card, debit card, cheque book or their official website.
- 3. NEVER use the phone number given to you by the cold caller. It will be their phone number, not the official one.
- 4. Fraudsters can buy an electronic device that, when they call you, will 'lock' your phone line into their phone. After you hang up, wait at least 5 minutes before using your phone again. That will clear their locking device off your phone line.
- 5. If you have followed the advice to hang up immediately you will not need to take this next step to stop yourself from being a victim. When the caller says "I just need to take you through some security to ensure I am talking to the right person". JUST HANG UP AND LOOK UP THE OFFICIAL TELEPHONE NUMBER OF YOUR BANK, CREDIT CARD PROVIDER OR OTHER FINANCIAL INSTUTUITION. If you do give them these details they can contact your bank etc and use them to impersonate you and get into your account.
- 6. If you think you might have been scammed, call your bank etc immediately and tell them. They now have dedicated teams to deal with the victims of scammers and can stop further fraudulent withdrawals for your account. They might offer to repay the money the scammers stole.

I've used the example of scammers pretending to be from you bank or credit card company but they can pretend to be from anyone you might trust and who genuinely holds your personal details and account numbers. Scammers pretend to be from building societies, the local authority, your utility provider, the tax inspector, Royal Mail, a parcel delivery company etc. The only safe way to deal with a call you had not asked for is to HANG UP IMMEDIATELY and follow step (1).

We plan to feature more advice to help you identify and stop scammers in future editions.



Stronger Marriages

My parents were married for 55 years. One morning, my mom was going downstairs to make dad breakfast, she had a heart attack and fell. My father picked her up as best he could and almost dragged her into the truck. At full speed, without respecting traffic lights, he drove her to the hospital.

When he arrived, unfortunately she was no longer with us.

During the funeral, my father did not speak; his gaze was lost. He hardly cried.

That night, his children joined him. In an atmosphere of pain and nostalgia, we remembered beautiful anecdotes and he asked my brother, a theologian, to tell him where Mom would be at that moment. My brother began to talk about life after death and guesses as to how and where she would be.

My father listened carefully. Suddenly he asked us to take him to the cemetery.

"Dad!" we replied, "it's 11 at night, we can't go to the cemetery right now!"

He raised his voice, and with a glazed look he said: "Don't argue with me, please don't argue with the man who just lost his wife of 55 years."

There was a moment of respectful silence, we didn't argue anymore. We went to the cemetery. With a flashlight we reached her grave.

My father sat down, prayed, and told his children: "It was 55 years... you know? No one can really talk about true love if haven't done life with a person."

He paused and wiped his face.

"She and I, we were together in the good and in the bad." he continued. "When I changed jobs, we packed up when we sold the house and moved. We shared the joy of seeing our children become parents, together we mourned the departure of loved ones, we prayed together in the waiting room of some hospitals, we supported each other in pain, we hugged one another each day, and we forgave mistakes."

And then he paused and added, "Children, that's all gone and I'm happy tonight. Do you know why I'm happy? Because she left before me. She didn't have to go through the agony and pain of burying me, of being left alone after my departure. I will be the one to go through that, and I thank God for that. I love her so much that I wouldn't have liked her to suffer..."

When my father finished speaking, my brothers and I had tears streaming down our faces. We hugged him and he comforted us, "It's okay. We can go home. It's been a good day."

That night I understood what true love is. It is more than just romanticism and sex, it's two people who stand beside one another, who are committed to one another ... through all the good and bad that life throws at you.


