Stoke Ash & Thwaite Parish Council – report on meeting held 17 March 2022

Holiday Lets – Stoke Ash – two parishioners attended the meeting to raise concerns over the behaviour, noise and disturbances from holiday makers staying at the Air B&B's in The Street. Their behaviour was impacting on neighbouring residents, particularly late at night by visitors using the hot tubs outside, trespassing into neighbouring gardens and on occasions abusive behaviour regarding car parking spaces. Parish Councillors appreciated the impact this was having on the quality of life of local residents and agreed to write to the owner of the properties requesting visitors were educated as to the behaviour expected in a quiet residential area so as to ensure residents of Stoke Ash were able to enjoy their homes free of distress and disturbance. The owner was informed the situation would be monitored and action taken should the rowdy and noisy behaviour continue.

Residents were urged to keep a record of any disturbances, date and time, and to pass this information on to the Parish Council if necessary. In the meantime Environmental Health at MSDC would be contact for advice.

<u>Parish Council Vacancies</u> – there are still two vacancies for Stoke Ash. It is important the Council is represented from all areas of the village. Meetings are now held bi-monthly May, July, September, November, January and March on the third Thursday evening of the month. Any parishioner, 18 years or over, interested in the wellbeing of the village and community is encouraged to contact a councillor or the clerk for further information.

<u>CPR Training</u> – the training held on 14 March and attended by all councillors had been very successful. If there is sufficient interest it is hoped further training can be arranged for any interested parishioners. Please do let a councillor or the clerk know if you would like to attend. This would be a training session held over one evening.

<u>Platinum Jubilee Celebrations: 2-5 June</u> – the celebrations are covered in a separate report in the magazine. Thanks were recorded to all those involved in the preparations.

Annual Parish Meetings held Thursday 28 April 2022 at Stoke Ash Village Hall Both Stoke Ash and Thwaite meetings were held on the same evening and although not well attended by parishioners a number of presentations were made by representatives from Community Groups, these were well received and much appreciated, particularly as many groups are now beginning to hold live meetings after the two-year closure due to covid - it had been good to hear of the activities planned for the coming months.

News from The Rectory

In April I was asked to report to the Parish Council, but unfortunately I submitted the wrong report. Please accept my apologies for the error, and any hurt that may have been caused. The correct version is printed below:

Thank you for asking me to give the report on behalf of the Church. Although our churches were allowed to re-open in July 2020 as part of easing Covid 19 restrictions, 2021 proved more challenging as cases continued to fluctuate, and the rules were constantly changing. We have produced many risk assessments to ensure the church was as safe as we could make it. We are operating a recovery rota at the moment with 1 service a month, alternating between Holy Communion one month and Worship for All the next.

During the year we have been able to celebrate Harvest, Remembrance and Christmas, and we were looking forward to the Village Carol Singing, which was also cancelled because of the high number of cases of Covid locally. We hope to join in next year. The Christmas Tree Festival was wonderful, and continues to provide a lovely festive focus in the village.

We have been very grateful for all the help we have received from volunteers with keeping the churchyard tidy, and also to Lionel Coe and Diane Poppy for keeping the grass cut. An enormous vote of thanks goes to our Churchwarden, June Scott, for the huge amount of work she does on behalf of the church and community. Our Treasurer, Pam Cooke also stepped down, having served the church for 8 years, and we are thankful for all the hard work she did on our behalf. We are very grateful to Val Lane for taking over the role of Treasurer.

We have many faithful and regular supporters, and are so thankful for all that you do, but we would like more new people on the PCC to enable us to continue our sustainability. Our vision going forward is for the parishes of Thorndon, Stoke Ash and Wetheringsett to cluster together more intentionally, led by the Rector and a ministry team. This will enable more regular services and events, improved administration, and more co-ordinated pastoral care.

STOKE ASH WI

In April, we were pleased to welcome Horry Parsons to our meeting. He was the project manager for the building/refurbishment works carried out on the Millennium Tower at Bury St Edmunds Cathedral.

He was very knowledgeable, not just about the building works, as you'd hope, but he also knew a lot about the history of the cathedral before then.

He told us that a master mason, by the name of John Wastell, designed and built the knave in 1503, and he also designed the beautiful vaulted ceiling at King's College, Cambridge, so his credentials as a craftsman were very sound. Further works were undertaken in the 18th and 19th centuries and these works included a new chancel by George Gilbert Scott, a Gothic Revival architect.

On this site, there has been a church of some description for many hundreds of years, which have been altered and rebuilt over time. It was in 1914 that it became a cathedral and in the 1960's to 1980's, Stephen Dykes Bower had improvement works carried out to various parts of the cathedral. When he died, the works were unfinished but he left a legacy of £2m for the works to be completed.

In 1996 Dean Attwell arrived at the cathedral and a funding application was put together for it to be included as one of the Millennium projects. The application was turned down three times before it was finally approved and works could commence. This was when Horry became involved as part of the team of one of the builders who would tender for the contract. He said his company's price was not the cheapest, but all tenderers were given the opportunity to be interviewed by the committee who would be selecting the builder. Once they had made their pitch, they were unanimously selected by the committee.

One of the specified stones to be used, Barnack, had to be sourced, even though it was well known within the industry that there was very little of it left anywhere and it was going to be difficult to find any. However, a stonemasonry company was able to source enough for the facing work, so it would match in with the original stonework on the cathedral.

The scaffolding, which had to remain in place for the duration of the works, was designed by a gentleman called Jack Jenna, a designer of free-standing scaffold, as it had to be completely detached from the building so that no damage was caused to the stonework. He was the man employed to design the scaffold that was used at Windsor Castle when it had to be rebuilt after the fire there.

His calculations covered 107 pages. All the scaffold used was brand new, there were 98 miles of scaffold tube and 128,000 fittings used. Apparently enough to cover 350 four-bed houses!

All bricks had to be purpose made using imperial measurements. There were 600,000 of them. Only lime mortar was used throughout, as this is in keeping with the original building, but they only had 6 months to find a suitable mix that would last for 1,000 years.

All works had to be completed by 2005.

Prince Charles, who was Patron of the St Edmundsbury Cathedral Millennium Project and County Appeal was invited to lay the first brick. Apparently, he was given a short lesson in bricklaying by David Peacock, one of the specialist bricklayers on the project. Prince Charles was supposed to stay on site for 50 minutes but enjoyed what he was doing there so much, his visit overran by an hour and 10 minutes.

Horry was, quite rightly, very proud of the work his team and their sub-contractors had done on the cathedral tower. It should now stand safe and proud until the next millennium.


