



STOKE ASH WI

Neil Hewitt came in July to tell us about the work of Marie Curie. He was inspired to volunteer for the charity organisation because they had supported him in the past, when a family member was very ill. Most of us know about the charity that assists and supports patients with cancer or other life threatening illnesses and their families, but we heard about Marie Curie herself and how her work helped towards changing the way cancer is treated and of course, the use of x-rays.

She was born in Poland in 1867 and was the daughter of a teacher of mathematics and physics. Once her education finished at 16, she was taught at a secret Polish institution as she was unable to get any further education, because she was a girl. She eventually went to the Sorbonne in Paris and gained Master's Degrees in physics and mathematics.

She met and married Pierre Curie in 1895 and had two daughters. She and her husband researched together and between them discovered the elements polonium and radium. In 1903 she received a Nobel Prize in Physics, jointly with her husband, for their work on radioactivity. Sadly, Pierre died in 1906 after being knocked down in the street by a horse and cart. She carried on with their research and in 1911 she won another Nobel Prize in Chemistry. This made her only the second person, and the first woman, to receive two Nobel prizes in two different fields of study. Her work lead to the discovery that radiation could help to see into our bodies through x-rays, and also to the curative powers of radiation on cancerous cells. Obviously these discoveries had many contributors over the years, but her research went a very long way towards furnishing the world with knowledge about the elements needed for the eventual treatments.

She died in 1934, at the age of 66, from aplastic anaemia, believed to have been caused by her prolonged exposure to radiation. It's such a tragedy that something that she discovered and that was often relied upon to help cure people was the cause of her death.

For our August meeting we had Jacqui Lawrence visit, with a wonderful collection of stamps and beautiful coloured inks. She showed us how to make our own cards, using the materials she provided.

We each got to choose whether we were going to make a general card, or one specifically for Christmas (it's coming!). Having got our blank card and our mission in mind, we were shown how to set up the design with the different stamps and ink pads. There was a marvellous bit of gadgetry that allowed you to attach your stamp to a template frame that made sure you could put exactly the same design onto as many cards as you wanted to, and it went to the same place on the card every time. Clever stuff!

All the cards could be personalised with colour and greetings, so we all ended up with a usable gift by the end of the evening. Jacqui did a marvellous job of showing us what to do, and assisting when we were in a muddle, and the time went far too quickly. I'm sure some of us will be inspired to do this again as she made it seem much more achievable than it first appeared. It was a thoroughly enjoyable evening.

If any ladies have been thinking of coming along but still haven't made it, please do come. You can come as a guest for an evening and, if you'd rather not come alone, contact the President, whose details are in the newsletter. She can put you in touch with someone who will bring you in and introduce you. There's a warm welcome (and tea and biscuits) waiting for you!

Meetings are held on the second Wednesday of each month at the village hall, starting at 7.30pm.

News from The Rectory - Just Ask

Thank you so much to all the wonderful volunteers who turned out recently to tidy the churchyard – it looks really good now. Our churchyards are sacred spaces, and those buried there are remembered, and laid to rest, with dignity and care. A Churchyard is a place of peace that is shared with the whole community. If a burial or interment of ashes of your loved one is to be in the churchyard, there will be decisions to make about the headstone which is made to mark the grave. It is really important to know that it's likely there will be strict restrictions on all of these decisions. The Diocesan rules are designed to preserve the peace and simplicity of the churchyard, and to ensure that nothing placed on any grave gets in the way of effective maintenance. The best thing to do is talk to the vicar or churchwarden in the parish where the burial will take place, and they will advise you about what is permitted.

There are leaflets in the church which give more detailed information about Churchyard rules, but if you are thinking about introducing a headstone into the churchyard – just ask.







Stoke Ash & Thwaite Parish Council – report on the meeting held 18 July 2019

<u>Exercise and Play equipment</u> - Members were pleased to note that the new play and exercise equipment on the Stoke Ash Village Hall green is being well used. This is a really useful addition to the village. The council will now look into further funding for play equipment for younger children. In the meantime members recorded thanks to Cllr Fleming for sourcing the equipment and for his regular checks on its condition and thanks to the Chairman, Cllr Morris, for keeping the grass cut.

<u>Lunch Club</u> – Cllr Leggett reported the monthly lunches had really taken off and were well attended on average by some 29 parishioners. The lunches continued throughout the summer and if supported will continue when the grant funding has expired in the autumn. Members recorded thanks to Cllr Leggett and Mrs Chris Maisey for organising the lunches, they have proved to be real community events.

<u>Community Working Groups</u> – the council is looking to set up two working groups to help with Wash Lane maintenance and the conversion of the former telephone kiosk in Stoke Ash street. Wash Lane will require some grass cutting and pruning and general tidying up the summer growth and the kiosk will require refurbishment and repainting. Our members would be very pleased to hear from anyone willing to help with these projects, just a few committed hours would be much appreciated. Please contact Cllr Mike Fleming if you are willing to help.

<u>Parish Council vacancies</u> – there are still two vacancies to be filled, one in Stoke Ash and one in Thwaite. It is important that both vacancies are filled so as to ensure the village is properly represented. Please do speak to a councillor or the clerk if you think you may be interested. Any parishioner, 18 years and over, with an interest in the villages and their wellbeing is be eligible.

<u>Speeding – Stoke Ash Street</u> – anti speeding measures for Stoke Ash street were discussed. The main concern from speeding appeared to be delivery vans. There was a suggestion the speed limit should be reduced to 20mph but Suffolk Cc Highways would require a record of accidents as part of the process to change a speed limit. County Cllr Stringer suggested, in the first instance, the use of high viz jackets with a 30mph logo for pedestrians and dog walkers to remind motorists of the speed limit.

<u>Defibrillator</u> – the cost of installing a defibrillator is being obtained from the Community Heartbeat Trust. The cost of equipment is in the region of $\pounds 2,000$ - $\pounds 3,000$. The Trust is very helpful in advising councils – it is hoped this can progress if funding can be obtained.


